Sojourners, Tourists, and Digital Settlers: Characterizing Culture in CALL

Abstract

The terms tourist and sojourner (Byram, 1997) have been used in fields of language learning to distinguish between two types of travelers: tourists who travel to experience other cultures and gather information about other ways of life with no intended shift in their personal beliefs, and sojourners who seek experiences that can challenge and potentially change their own and others' views. These two labels, though still relevant, merit reexamination in light of the rapid pace at which Internet technologies have enabled almost all language learners, not just those preparing for travel or sojourns abroad, to experience other languages and cultures. In our increasingly globalized and interconnected world, a third descriptor, that of the digital settler, adds to the ways we explore and encounter cultural experiences both on and offline. In this talk, I review recent CALL research that focuses on various aspects of culture and of intercultural learning and examine how these labels of sojourner, tourist, and digital settler help characterize orientations toward culture within CALL research.

Bio-data

Paige Ware is an associate professor in the Department of Teaching and Learning at Southern Methodist University. Her research focuses on the use of Internet-based communication for promoting intercultural awareness through international and domestic online language and culture partnerships, as well as on the use of multimedia technologies for fostering language and literacy growth among adolescents. Her research has been funded by the TESOL International Research Foundation for English Language Education (TIRF), by the National Academy of Education's Spencer post-doctoral fellowship, and by an SMU Ford Fellowship. In addition to her research and teaching, she is also the reviews editor for *Language Learning & Technology*; a member of the TESOL Technology Standards authoring team; and the principal investigator of a Department of Education Office of English Language Acquisition (OELA) professional development grant that supports secondary school educators in obtaining their ESL supplemental certification.
